


Stunning Drop in Real GDP in First Half of 2020



Total U.S. Retail Sales \$B Seasonally Adjusted at Annual Rates






Revived: Motor Vehicles New Orders Recovers, Production Follows


Rebounding: Hospital Sector Back Sharply

ISM Services Index: Hospital Subsector





Rebounding: Health Care Employment Recovering Led by Recovery in Ambulatory Care








Recessionary: Mass Entertainment Closer to Zero than Last Year's Levels


Recessionary: K-12 Education: The Virtual Lockdown in Local Schools

One-Third of K-12 Students Not In Full Session




Local Public Education Unprecedented Jobs Loss

Recessionary: Higher Education Enrollment Shrinks. Job Losses Follow




State Higher Education Job Loses Widening

State Higher Education Employment Year Over Year Change in Thousands








Outside of Aircraft, Durable Goods Orders Rebound

Manufacturers Durable Goods Orders Excluding Aircraft and Parts




After April Collapse Wisconsin Manufacturing Moves Back to Expansion






Different Results Even Within an Industry Reflect the Cross-Currents The Case of Machinery Manufacturing

Value of Shipments, Percent Change Over Prior Year






U.S. and Wisconsin Unemployment Rates Down Sharply from April Peak

Percent of Workforce Unemployed








Real GDP Still 3.5% Below 2019 Q4 Peak

Full Recovery for Employment by 2022 Q4








Wisconsin's Economic Outlook: Unemployment Rate Declines Starting 3rd Qtr. 2020, Reaches Full Employment in 2023



Wisconsin Employment Rebounding Recovered by Late 2022




Wisconsin Manufacturing Employment Turnaround Started In Third Quarter






Wisconsin Trade Weighted Value of the Dollar Declining After the Spring Spike

Wisconsin Exports Recovering from Spring COIVD Contraction




Wisconsin Trade Weighted Dollar Falling Faster Than Most States






Continuing Decline in the Trade Value of the U.S Dollar Should Sustain Stronger Exports




Broad Trade Weighted Value of U.S. Dollar
