HIGHLIGHTS: OCTOBER 2020

- Wisconsin businesses exported \$16,832,193,939 worth of products during the first ten months of 2020. That was 7.4% less than in the same period in 2019. Total U.S. exports were down by 14.52%. Wisconsin ranks #21 among the 50 states in exports, one spot higher than October of last year. Only five states—Nevada, Oregon, New Jersey, Utah and Colorado—saw higher year-to-date exports in October 2020 than in October 2019.
- Countries that purchased more from Wisconsin during the first 10 months of this year compared to last year were led by Hong Kong (up \$153 million, or 86.5%), China (up \$152.8 million, or 13.62%) and Chile (up \$113 million, or 57.47%). Significant declines occurred with Mexico (down \$739 million, or 26.18%) and Canada (down \$622 million, or 10.81%).
- Product categories that experienced significant growth compared to the same time period in 2019 included prepared bakers' mixes (up \$43.8 million, or 54.4%) and albumins, starches and enzymes (up \$33.6 million, or 29.89%). Significant declines occurred with industrial machinery (down \$313 million, or 9.3%) and electrical machinery (down \$263 million, or 18.8%).
- Wisconsin imports decreased by 9.46% compared to the same time period last year. Industrial machinery is
 the largest category of Wisconsin's imports, but it declined by 6.54% to \$4.3 billion. The special category of
 goods to be repaired or returned experienced the greatest growth among import categories (up \$102 million, or
 17.23%). Total U.S. imports decreased by 8.94%.
